Favor from God on those who Savor a Savior. In the New American Bible (Revised Edition) Luke 2:14 reads "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests." Favor is worthy of study. A Christian who suffers unjustly for Christ will have favor with God. In Genesis 6:8 we find an example of Noah, "But Noah found favor in the eyes of the Lord." We often leave the passage thinking that Noah is just another godly man. Noah



endured unjust treatment and ridicule for at least a century or more. Exodus 33:17 The Lord said to Moses, "I will also do this thing of which you have spoken; for you have found favor in My sight and I have known you by name." Moses also suffered much grief in following Yahweh. 1 Peter 2:20 "For what credit is there if, when you sin and are harshly treated, you endure it with patience? But if when you do what is right and suffer for it you patiently endure it, this finds favor with God." 1 Peter 2:19 "For this finds favor, if for the sake of conscience toward God a person endures grief when suffering unjustly." I also find it fascinating that favor is found three times with Mary who suffered a lifetime of judgement from her community. Luke 1:25 "This is the way the Lord has dealt with me in the days when He looked with favor upon me, to take away my disgrace among people." Luke 1:28 And coming in, he said to her, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." Luke 1:30 And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. Jesus also suffered this same unjust judgement with Mary, and it is said of Him in Luke 2:40 "Now the Child continued to grow and to become strong, increasing in wisdom; and the favor of God was upon Him." Also, in Luke 2:52 "And Jesus kept increasing in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and people."

Christmas contains a flavor of bitter sweetness if understood properly. I remember my mom giving me a bitter lesson by letting me taste vanilla extract straight off a teaspoon. Yuck! That was one lesson I did not have to repeat. Bitter sweetness can be flavorful if we have the right balance. Satan wants us to focus on the miracle of birth, an innocent baby, and a story without its cataclysmic and victorious ending. If Christmas is "all in" on cuteness, sweetness, bright lights, and abundance of peace, good will, and presents, you might want to take a step back and look again at the meaning of Christmas. For the true Christian, Christmas always has a hard edge to it. The birth, cross, and the empty tomb must all go together. God's love cannot be shown without the cost being told about. Peace cannot be experienced unless one knows the Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6) who gifted it to us with His precious perfect blood. It is a great season to celebrate Christ's birth because of the story downstream. This pastor does not want you to be a wet blanket at your Christmas parties but be clear eyed. Make sure your friends and family know the "reason for the season." Read out loud the Christmas Story. So, when you bite into some dark chocolate, or a heavily zested lemon bar, remember that the story of Christmas is not complete unless it ends with an empty tomb. It also ends with a Christian who is "all in" to the point of finding favor with God. Saints of God, I want you to have a wonderful Christmas full of traditions and family. Say "Merry Christmas!" boldly and without apology and be ready to tell the whole story, His (Jesus) Story (History).
